



## FAQs on Online Assessment

### Does this apply to all students registered for October?

Yes, if you are registered you will be writing examinations online.

### Do I need to re-register?

No, you do not need to re-register. If you registered in May your exam was transferred to October. You can however at any time add additional subjects to your existing registration.

### What will I need?

Students will need a laptop or desktop computer and an internet connection.

### Question Paper and answering?

Students will receive the question paper online and will answer all questions online. The format of the paper will be similar to previous years. However, it will appear in an online format. The question will appear and there will be a space to type in your answer.

### What software, if any specific software is required for the different subjects

### How much time per exam?

Exam times will remain as is 3hrs 15 minutes - the system will be automatically set up like this – students will be able to log on at 0845 and will automatically be logged out at 12h00. Their answers will be saved every few

minutes and there will be a “fifteen - five minutes to end” warning. There may be some time given for submitting the answers. More information to follow.

**Will CGISA be providing Students with data?**

No students will have to buy their own data for a 3-hour exam. We are not an Institute of Higher Learning and have no arrangements with cell phone companies. Exams cannot be written using a cell phone. Students must use a laptop or desktop computer and must have access to wi-fi. Students should write from home, from work, or from a relative who has wi-fi.

**Will the exam be administered like the assignment where students receive an email and submit via email?**

No, the exam must be written on the online platform and will be submitted on the online platform.

**Who can we contact/email our questions to?**

**Will there be training and when will students be advised?**

Yes, students will be trained and can practise beforehand.
